Is DO right for Your Students?

Oftentimes, students know they want to become doctors, but they aren't clear on the distinction between osteopathic and allopathic medicine. As advisors, you are uniquely positioned to help students understand which pathway is right for them. If you're talking to a student who has the following traits, they may be a future osteopathic doctor:

- Leads with compassion and wants to make a difference in people's lives
- Wants to see patients as more than just a set of symptoms or a disease
- Believes that wellness includes the mind, body, and spirit Is interested in an approach to medicine that emphasizes prevention
- Values community involvement

DOs are fully licensed physicians who can practice in primary care and medical specialties, not unlike their MD counterparts. When talking to your students about the DO distinction, these three points are key:

- develop healthy lifestyles and prevent illness.
- DOs are the only physicians required to complete training in Osteopathic Manipulative Treatment (OMT), a hands-on technique that involves using the hands to diagnose, treat, and prevent illness or injury. OMT training is built into the DO curriculum and provides DOs with an additional tool beyond medication and surgery to help alleviate pain, restore motion, and support the body's natural healing processes.
