## Report on Osteopathic Medicine Placements in 2018 Matches

Graduates of the nation's osteopathic medical schools historically have had multiple opportunities for placement in graduate medical education (residencies). Doctor of Osteopathic Medicine (DO) graduates may participate in the American Osteopathic Association/National Matching Service (AOA/NMS) match for AOA accredited GME, the National Residency Matching Program (NRMP) match and Supplemental Offer and Acceptance Program (SOAP) for ACGME accredited GME, the military match (for those graduates with military service commitments), and other placements (for example the San Francisco match). Because of these multiple opportunities, the outcomes of GME placement for DO graduates are not known until several weeks after the formal matches. However, with the development of the single graduate medical education accreditation system and with AOA-accredited programs achieving ACGME-accreditation and choosing to participate in the NRMP match, opportunities in the AOA/NMS match are rapidly declining. The last AOA/NMS match is expected to occur in 2019. Osteopathic medical graduates will participate in the NRMP match beginning in 2020 (with the exception of those with military service commitments or participating in the San Francisco match). This year alone, the NRMP reports a significant increase in the number of positions in the match due to the transition to the single accreditation system. This report is based on data provided by the colleges available as of April 12, 2018 and may differ from data from other sources such as AOA or NRMP.

Through the GME match/placement process in 2018, AACOM collected data from the COMs to determine the placement of DO graduates in GME. All COMs participated in the data collection. Each college, branch campus, and additional location is reported independently (except Michigan State University COM where all locations are combined).

Data reported by the COMs show that 98.75 percent of spring 2018 graduates seeking GME successfully placed into graduate medical education as of April 12, 2018. (There may be additional placements however the number of remaining GME positions is limited.) This represents 6,224 new physicians beginning their graduate medical education in July 2018. This compares to the 2017 match/placement process when 5,898 new physicians entered GME (99.34 percent of graduates seeking GME) and 2016 when 5,356 graduates were successfully matched/placed -- 99.61 percent of graduates seeking GME. The two-year increase of over 900 graduates is accounted for by three COMs graduating their first classes in 2017, two COMs graduating their first classes in 2018 and growth at existing COMs.






